Dear Parents and Caregivers,

His funeral will be held on Monday and several staff members will be attending so there will be some disruptions to normal class routines for some classes. All children will be supervised and will have work set by their teachers. At this point we are unsure when Mrs Plummer will be returning to work and her class will continue to be taught by Ms Dobson. I'm sure that you will join with me in keeping Mrs Plummer and her children in your thoughts and prayers.

I am still hoping to run a parent workshop soon on Social Media and Cyber-bullying in conjunction with the police. Our school like every other is not immune from this. I will give you details of the work shop in the next few weeks.

My apologies to the P&C for not being able to attend this week's meeting. Mr Woudsma has filled me in on the meeting, and I look forward to seeing you next month.


